Through coordinated policy alignment and investments, the EU can enter a new phase of technological advancement - one that enhances the competitiveness of its technological and industrial ecosystems, including the vital European defense sector.

This conference will serve as a dynamic platform for multistakeholder dialogue on the EU's evolving approach to technological autonomy. It is designed to facilitate both high-level strategic discussions and practical sessions focused on implementation, creating a comprehensive framework to support the EU's long-term technological ambitions. The conference aims not only to produce actionable insights and policy recommendations but also to act as a catalyst for future collaborative projects.

Key questions to be analyzed:

Building sovereign digital and technological infrastructures and driving innovation through public-private-research partnerships

Creating an environment that supports innovation through enhanced collaboration among public institutions, research organizations and the private sector to boost emerging startups and established technology companies;

Aligning regulatory frameworks and funding strategies to channel investments and accelerate the development and deployment of advanced technologies across both defense and civilian sectors.

Strengthening the EU defense technological and production base to secure strategic autonomy and resilience.
